

CAMP PEGGY O'BRIEN INFORMATION

What to expect: A convenient base camp in the central High Peaks Region.

What not to expect: Indoor plumbing, electricity, linens, and blankets. Mattresses are provided but there are no blankets.

Combination Locks: Each cabin has a four digit, roller-type combination lock. For security reasons, we regularly change the combinations on these locks. **TO OBTAIN THE CORRECT COMBINATION, YOU MUST CALL ADIRONDAK LOJ (518-523-3441 9AM-7PM) WITHIN SEVEN DAYS OF YOUR EXPECTED ARRIVAL AT CAMP O'BRIEN. PAYMENT IN FULL IS DUE AT LEAST 30 DAYS PRIOR TO ARRIVAL.**

Propane Gas: Propane fuels the lights, and counter top cooking units. When you arrive it will be necessary to go outside and open the valve on the gas cylinder, providing gas to the cabin. Open valve all the way, then turn back one turn so it could be easily turned off in an emergency. When turned on, the in line pressure gauge should be white. If red, the cylinder is empty. If two cylinders are hooked up, first try to switch service to the other cylinder. If both are empty, turn off valves tightly, disconnect compression fitting with wrench (clockwise), and replace with full cylinder. **Do not turn off gas that is connected to the heater.**

Lights: Please exercise care in lighting the propane lights. The on/off valve is the ONLY moving part which you need to touch (other moving parts include a globe release which will send the \$10.00 globe crashing to the floor.) The on/off valve resembles an allen wrench and is located on the side of the unit. To light: 1) Push & Turn on/off valve 90 degrees.
2) Hold match between top of the globe and small metal cap. To extinguish, return valve to original position.

Heater: Camp Peggy O'Brien is equipped with a propane heater. Complete and explicit operating instructions are provided on location.

Cook top: Camp Peggy O'Brien is equipped with a propane cook top. Please exercise caution when lighting. Push knob in and turn and light with match. There may be mice in the camps so please be sure to secure all food properly. Snap traps are provided if you'd like to assist getting rid of them and more are available at John's Brook Lodge.

*There is NOT a refrigerator in Camp Peggy O'Brien.

Water: Due to improper sanitation practices of some hikers, the quality of drinking water in the High Peaks is currently questionable at best. Water is available at a spigot outside Johns Brook Lodge from Memorial Day Weekend through Columbus Day weekend. Otherwise, water should be filtered, chemically treated, or brought to a rolling boil for a minimum of 2 min (N.Y.S. Health Department recommendation).

Carry it in, Carry it out: A set inventory has been established at the camps for your benefit. To maintain this inventory and eliminate the accumulation of unwanted junk, it is imperative that you carry out every last thing that was carried in. Please resist the temptation to leave excess food and other items behind for "someone else." What seems like a nice gesture is, in fact, an unmanageable problem for us. Help us by removing all items not listed as part of the established inventory (see reverse).

Vault Privy: Both camps are utilizing a vault privy system. Sewage is collected in 55-gallon drums and flown by helicopter annually to a conventional treatment facility. **DO NOT THROW GARBAGE IN THE DRUMS** - it is expensive to fly out and inhibits the treatment process.

Tents and other temporary structures are not allowed at the camps.

Fires and open flames are not allowed in the buildings or on the surrounding grounds.

Meals are not available at Johns Brook Lodge.

Emergency Help: From Memorial Day to Columbus Day, help is available at Johns Brook Lodge and the Ranger Station. On Saturdays from mid-December to April, there will be a caretaker in the warming hut next to Johns Brook Lodge from 8am to 5pm. It may sometimes be necessary to go to Keene Valley for help. If possible, send at least two people. DEC Regional Office, Ray Brook: 897-1200 or 891-0235 (dispatch). Adirondak Loj: 523-3441. These numbers are for EMERGENCY USE ONLY.

Before you leave: Please give the broom a good workout and leave everything as neat and clean as you would like to find it.

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP PEGGY O'BRIEN

FROM THE NORTH OR SOUTH:

Take I-87 (Northway) to Exit 30.
Turn north on Rt. 73. Proceed to Keene Valley.

FROM THE WEST:

Take Rt. 3 or 86 into Saranac Lake.
Continue on 86 through Lake Placid.
At the second traffic light, turn right on Rt. 73.
Proceed to Keene Valley.

ONCE IN KEENE VALLEY

Look for High Peaks Trailhead sign (next to Ausable Inn). Turn onto Adirondack St. at .6 miles the road turns right, crossing Johns Brook on a wooden bridge. Continue uphill following yellow trail markers and signs to the Garden. Pavement ends as road approaches Garden parking area. From trail register, take yellow marked Phelps trail to Grace and O'Brien Camps (3.4 mi.). This is the most direct route to the camps. The trail passes Bear Brook lean-to (.9 mi.), and Deer Brook lean-to (1.3 mi.) before reaching the Ranger Station (3.0 mi.; open May-Oct.). Continue on the yellow trail past the Ranger Station. O'Brien and Grace Camps (3.4 mi.) are located on the south side of Johns Brook (left side of the trail coming from the Garden). A bridge marked with a sign with the names of the camps will be visible going across Johns Brook. After crossing over the bridge continue about 150 feet upstream to Grace Camp. About 1/4 mile upstream is Camp O'Brien (on the same side of Johns Brook as Grace Camp). Camp O'Brien is located directly across Johns Brook from Johns Brook Lodge.

Parking at the Garden

The Garden parking lot (operated by the town of Keene) costs \$10 per day (\$13 Canadian) from mid-May through the end of October (2017 rate). An attendant is on duty 1 p.m.-7 p.m. Fridays and 7 a.m.-7 p.m. Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays. Town employees and DEC rangers monitor the lot during the week.

When the lot is full, free overflow parking is available at Marcy Airfield 2.5 miles north of Keene Valley. There is a \$10 round-trip charge to ride the shuttle the 3.5 miles to the Garden trailhead. The shuttle operates from 7 a.m.-7 p.m. on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays from late May to mid-October.
